Food Insecurity is Growing in our Community

Moraine Township Food Pantry usage increased almost 70% between June and October, 2013. A staggering 27.5% of our School District 112 students qualify for the low-income federal free and reduced lunch program. When residents visit our pantry, in addition to bags of dried food and canned goods, we also provide frozen meat. Fresh produce is offered when possible.

Residents who would like to help the Township in this effort are welcome to bring contributions of unexpired, non-perishable food to our office weekdays 8:30 - 4:30.

Moraine Township Freezes Tax Levy

Township trustees voted to freeze its tax levy for existing taxpayers.

Moraine Township accounts for less than .9% of your property tax bill (around \$100 on a \$500,000 home).

Approximately half of the Township levy supports the Assessor's office.

The balance funds General and Emergency Assistance and a Food Pantry for residents in need; transportation services for seniors and disabled residents; grants to social service agencies that provide a safety net for our most vulnerable residents; and capital and maintenance expenses for two cemeteries.

Moraine Township has volunteer Navigators who have completed more than 40 hours of training and passed a criminal background check to help residents enroll for insurance under the Affordable Care Act. Call 847-432-3240 to schedule an appointment with a trained and certified Navigator to help you understand your choices and ensure you receive any subsidy you are income-qualified to receive. Appointments are available weekday, weekend or evening hours.
